

SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE FROM THE NEW MEXICO SOCIETY OF CPAs

NMSCPA Scholarships

The Society established its Educational Fund on June 29, 1961. As the professional association for CPAs, its membership includes professionals in public accounting, private industry, government and education. The Society promotes the value associated with the CPA designation and strives to attract highly qualified individuals to the profession. Full-time and non-degree students at any qualifying school are eligible for Society scholarships.

W. E. Hammond Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship, established in memory of W. Ernest Hammond by his family, celebrates his dedication to the CPA profession and NMSCPA. Mr. Hammond was a long standing partner in the Albuquerque office of KPMG Peat Marwick. He served as president of the Society from 1939 to 1946. This award is given to an eligible student at any qualifying school.

George Pulakos Memorial Scholarship

Established in 1999, this memorial scholarship honors the memory of George Pulakos, founding partner in Pulakos & Alongi, Ltd., who served the CPA profession for nearly 50 years. One scholarship is awarded to an eligible student from any qualifying school.

Sanford Rogoff Memorial Scholarships

First awarded in 2007, these three scholarships honor the memory of Sanford Rogoff, a founding member of The Rogoff Firm. His widow, Mrs. Beverly Rogoff, established the memorial fund. This scholarship is given to a recipient who expresses the intention to go into public practice in Albuquerque.

J. Bryan Stephenson Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship memorializes one of New Mexico's first CPAs. Mr. Stephenson held NM Certificate #3 and is remembered through the major contribution of his widow, Mrs. Mary M. Stephenson, and KPMG Peat Marwick William Black Foundation in New York. This scholarship is awarded to a student at the University of New Mexico, who also matriculated from a New Mexico high school.

Albuquerque Chapter of CPAs Scholarships

The Albuquerque Chapter of CPAs is the largest of the Society's six local organizations. It provides activities and programs of specific interest to Albuquerque's CPAs. The chapter funds two scholarships for students with a permanent home address in the Albuquerque metro area.

Doña Ana Chapter of CPAs Scholarships

The Doña Ana Chapter of CPAs, Las Cruces, is offering two scholarships to students who are residents of Doña Ana County majoring in accounting at any college or university in New Mexico.

Women to Watch/Robert Half International Scholarship
